Here are the ways to pray we talked about last week:

PRAISE

Spend some time right now thanking God as you prepare your heart for the prayer tour.

ASK

Ask God to bless our friends, neighbors, and even people we do not know! You can pray
however you would like, but if you do not know where to start, you can start by saying,
"Lord Jesus, I ask that you would bless" Think of as many people and places as you
can! You can make a list on another piece of paper to bring with you on the Prayer Tour.

A neighbor you do not know	The workers from that restaurant
A school near my home	Someone who does not know Jesus
The teachers in that school	Someone who is sick
The students that go to that school	The city of Camarillo

YIELD

Remember that to yield means to trust God's plan, no matter what happens. One way to yield is to try to listen to hear what God might be saying to us while we pray.
