As a church we will read through these letters one chapter at a time. Monday-Friday we will mull over the chapter for that week. You can read it from beginning to end once each day, or you can spend time honing in on a few particular verses each day. However you study, we hope that as we read together we will be encouraged by what Paul thought, and the things he felt, and what he wrote during his time under house arrest.
