NOAH

(Genesis 5:28-9:29)

Genesis 4-5 records a number of generations after Adam. In the beginning of chapter 6 we learn that as population increased, so did the prevalence of sin---so much so that God was deeply grieved and was inclined to destroy them all.

But there was one man who was righteous---Noah, a man who pleased God. The Lord decided to save Noah and his family while destroying the wicked generation of that time.

Noah was told to build a huge boat (ark) 450 feet long, 45 feet high, and 75 feet wide. God was to bring a great flood upon the earth. He would bring all kinds of animals for Noah to put in the ark.
