2. What reason does God give for the famine, and why is it surprising that this issue resurfaces so many years later? What does this teach about us the consequence of sin and the nature of God's justice?

3. Why is it important that God remains just even when He shows mercy? What would be lost—biblically and morally—if God were merciful but not just?

4. The story includes real judgment, but it also includes compassion and care for bodies and burial (something very important in ancient Jewish culture). What does that suggest about God's heart even when consequences are deserved?

5. Why do you think we demand justice from others yet are offended about the concept of a just God? Why is God's justice good news for believers?

6. In what ways does the gospel hold justice and mercy together?

APPLICATION QUESTION:

Take some time to reflect and pray. Where in your life might God be inviting you to stop avoiding justice—owning, confessing, or making right what has been left unresolved—where might He be inviting you to finally receive mercy that Christ has already secured for you, or who might God be calling you to extend mercy towards, even if justice still remains?
