Dear Kingston family,

It is hard to believe November has arrived. November in South Carolina means the arrival of cooler temperatures, the changing of the leaves, the celebration of Thanksgiving, and in most years, the arrival of Advent at the end of November. November also means something else that we are all aware of and often reluctant to discuss. If we are not careful, this month can bring out the worst in us and divide us like nothing else. Yes, I am talking about election day.

I must admit, politics fascinate me. I believe they are important. I mean, as adults we pay taxes, right? When we vote, we are essentially saying, "This is who I want making decisions about my tax dollars." As your pastor, my hope is that all of you reading this exercise your civic duty and vote.

That being said, whatever happens with your favorite candidate or political party you align with, your reaction to your party winning or losing speaks volume about your Christian witness. I see this on both sides of the aisle. Whether your party wins or loses, *how* you win or lose is important. I want to say something bold here: emotionally immature winners rub it in their opponents faces, post nasty, degrading words on social media, and they go out of their way to prove how "right" they were. Sadly, many will invoke the name of Jesus to say their "win" was an answered prayer.

On the other hand, emotionally immature losers will find every excuse to justify their loss. I mean your party could not have possibly just lost out right, right? Cheating, fraud, ballot harvesting, Russian collusion, Satan infiltrating people's souls, and evil forces are just a few excuses I have heard. And once again, we invoke the name of Jesus when we lose. The people that voted for that "evil" party are clearly lost and need Jesus in their life. If they followed *our* version of Jesus, they would never vote for... fill in the blank.

As I have said in the pulpit on multiple occasions, people vote for/align with particular political parties, not because they are stupid or immoral. Research has shown people vote based on their *lived experience*. Election season is a good reminder that every single person is made in the image of God, with hurts, fears, and trauma in their past as well as hopes and dreams for their future. We have families we go home to at night that love are care about us. Most of us are trying to make this city and country a better place. So often, I think we forget this, and when politics get involved, we resort to writing someone off, canceling, labeling, or even condemning them to hell.

I think we can do better. I think we should do better. I think we can see another person as made in the image of Christ, even if we disagree. What if when you disagree with someone over your favorite hot button topic (abortion, guns, immigration, race, LGBTQ rights, vaccines, tax policy, etc...), you responded with: "You know, I disagree with your stance on that issue, *but* as a human being, fellow American citizen, and someone made in the image of God, I *respect* your right to have that opinion." Being respectful costs you nothing. Being respectful opens the door for conversation. Being respectful unites rather than divides. Being respectful shows people in which we disagree that we value their dignity as a human being. What would the church's witness look like if we embodied that posture? I believe more people would want to come to church. I think more people would want to know more about Jesus and as great as this country is, I think it would be even better.

Now is our opportunity to make it that way.



Compassion Child Update


Below is information from Paul Reed, our chair of Stewardship and Mission:

She also sent a drawing of a stethoscope which she colored."


