Dear Kingston Family,

September gave us plenty to worry about: saying bye to Kip Roberts for a couple of years, your pastor fighting COVID, and now a Hurricane bearing down on Horry County. Not to mention, we have a handful of members fighting cancer. Other members are dealing with health issues or personal struggles. On top of all of this, we have had some of our members join the church triumphant.

When I look at all of these challenges, our church shows up to help every time. Think about how special that service in the sanctuary was for Kip. Many of you remarked that you had never experienced a prayer service like that ever before, and I have to say, neither have I. Think about the funerals we have had here, like Adrienne's? As hard as it was, it was an amazing tribute to her life. It was one of the most meaningful funerals I have ever been a part of, and I was honored to be part. This does not include all of the other special services we have had this year.

I think about this battle with COVID our family has dealt with and how many of you reached out. You have asked if you could make a run by the grocery store, checked in to see how I am feeling, or just dropped a meal by for us to eat. I know we still disagree on things and there will always be some degree of conflict about the right way to "be church", we are human being after all. However, at the end of the day, you all should be really proud of how we have shown up for others in the past year.

Now, here is why I say all this: I want this church to *keep* showing up for others. My hopes and dreams are that we will continue to have meaningful worship, connectional fellowship, and of course, good food. Whether in the fellowship hall for Wednesday supper or taking it to someone's house who is hurting. October 30th is Stewardship Sunday, and in order for the church to continue to be the church, we have to receive adequate financial gifts. One of my favorite verses when it comes to stewardship is Paul's verses to the church in Corinth:


#### **Wednesday Night Cooks/Door Counters**



### From the Music Director:

What is Kingston's Favorite Hymn? We had 52 hymns selected as favorites, but of those, one hymn got an overwhelming majority of votes. That hymn is "Blessed Assurance." The words were written by Fanny J. Crosby and music composed by Phoebe Knapp in 1873. Fanny Crosby was blind her entire life and authored over 3,000 hymns. She volunteered much of her time in the shelters and soup kitchens of NYC, ministering to the most underserved populations. Look for this hymn in Sunday worship soon.

Reminder: Choir rehearsal is every Wednesday at 7 pm, following our Wednesday supper. The choir is open to everyone high school and up. We are always looking for new voices to add to the choir. Come give us a try! You'll likely end up becoming a permanent choir member.
