Dear Kingston Family,

New Years is one of my favorite holidays. I love staying up to watch the ball drop in times square. All the top college football games are usually either on New Years Eve or New Year's Day. There is also something about the changing of the calendar year that has the feeling of a fresh start. When I finished undergrad back in 2004, for the next couple of years I worked in the fitness industry as a personal trainer. The first week of January we would always have a flood of new memberships. Hundreds of people were ready to lose weight or get stronger and more fit. New Year's Resolutions as we call them, but about half of them were gone by the beginning of February. It is hard to change. However, New Years is a good time to look at our habits, our behavior, and our life as a whole and ask ourselves, "Am I living in a way that truly honors God?" While losing weight or starting an exercise program are certainly admirable lifestyle changes, 1 Timothy actually encourages us to go a bit deeper. On a side note, 1 Timothy is traditionally attributed to Paul, but modern scholarship casts doubt on his authorship. If he did write 1 Timothy he was an old man, but most likely someone wrote on behalf of Paul after his death which was not uncommon in the 1st century. The writer tells Timothy in 1 Timothy 4:8: "for, while physical training is of some value, godliness is valuable in every way, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come." The writer actually acknowledges that activities like exercise, "physical training" as the writer says is of value! But that godliness is valuable in every way! The Greek word translated "godliness" is "εὐσέβεια" (eusebia). It can be translated as godliness, holiness, piety or even devotion (to God). What are some ways you could show more devotion to God? Here are some spiritual disciplines to consider: Reading your Bible daily, being more intentional in your prayer life, committing to worship on Sundays, confession (admitting your wrongs), forgiveness (giving our past hurts to God), generosity (managing our money in a way that allows us to give more), or service (volunteering for a church function or mission project). There are many other spiritual disciplines I could mention, but these are a few that came to mind as I thought about how we can grow in our relationship with God and with others. I'm proud of the many ways this church ministered to our members as well as our community at large. Let us continue to be a church of hope and love as we grow together in 2023.
