### **JUNE 2023**

Dear Kingston family,

I enjoyed our time this past Sunday talking about Pentecost and how we can understand the elusive and often controversial doctrine known as the "Holy Spirit." Even as a pastor, someone theologically trained, I still have a hard time finding the right words to talk about the Holy Spirit. Yet, if there is one unmistakable and I would even dare to say an undeniable sense of God's presence over the course of my life, I would attribute it to the Holy Spirit.

For me, the Holy Spirit has often been that sense of someone telling me, "You need to do this...." or "Yes, this is the direction for your life." Certainly the Spirit was at work as I was discerning where to go to college 23 years ago. I still see the Spirit working in our seniors' lives today as they are discerning their next steps as "grown ups." No doubt the Spirit was at work calling me to seminary and even calling me here almost 2 years ago (can you all believe August will be 2 years?). However, there are three moments where the Spirit's work has stood out to me more than any other. One was a personal matter over a decade ago, and the other two were quite recently, both involving Kingston members.

I remember back in 2012, my Dad's mother ("Oma") was not doing well. She was living in Connecticut with my Aunt and Uncle. She was a wonderful grandmother to me and sadly, I did not get to spend as much time with her growing up because she always lived a solid plane ride out of town from where I grew up in Spartanburg, SC. On particular afternoon I called my Uncle, and he said that Oma was not doing well and was not sure how much longer she would make it. I was torn. I wanted to see her one more time. Would she hold on longer? A week? A month? The Spirit nudged me in that moment, "buy a plane ticket and go now." I was on a plane later that afternoon. I flew into Hartford, my cousin picked me up at the airport, and we drove to their house in Cheshire, CT. The next day as my Oma died, I held her hand, we prayed and read the 23rd Psalm together. It was the first time I had ever watched a human being pass away. Of course, my Christian convictions lead me to believe she is gone to be with the Lord now and I will see her again one day. In other ways though, I feel she ordained me to ministry that morning.

Fast forward to last weekend. I was talking with our own Beth Healy, and at one point, the conversation turned to Kip. For those of you who don't know or maybe new to Kingston, Kip is Beth's son and is incarcerated in Illinois. Although Kip has received phone calls and letters, Beth began to tell me had only received one in person visitor he knows. And right at that moment the Holy Spirit literally whacked me over the head. I heard the Spirit say to me "Robert, what are you waiting for? Why have you not gone to see Kip? It's been almost a year!" The words of Matthew 25...

became loud as ever in my brain. Matthew 25:36 reads "....I was in prison and you visited me..." and then at verse 40 Jesus says "...Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." Right then I told Beth, I'm going to go see him, tell Kip I'm coming to see him." So I got off the phone, booked a visitation spot at the prison (after answering 8,000 questions and a background check). Found a hotel nearby, booked my flights, and I'm happy to say, Tuesday afternoon June 6th, I hope to see Kip face to face.

Now, here is what I need prayer for. Like big prayers: 1) **Pray for me.** I have never been inside a prison in my entire life. I've never had any opportunity to do prison ministry until now. 2) **Pray for our visit.** Even though I am approved, if there is any threat of a security breach or need for the prison to go on lock down, all visits are cancelled for the day and you have to reschedule. 3) **Pray for Kip**. This has been a rough road as you can imagine, but pray that our time together, should the Holy Spirit allow it to happen, would lift his spirits. As I said Sunday, the Holy Spirit is always at work, but as I realized last weekend, sometimes I am just not paying attention. Are you?


