Dear Kingston family,

It seems the older I get, the faster time seems to go. I cannot believe as I sit here typing this article, this is the last day of August. In most churches, fall is kind of like a new year in the church. Most churches in the south slow down a bit in the summer. I think every Presbyterian church I've served has their session and deacons take a break from meeting in July. Summer is a time to vacation and enjoy the pool or the beach.

In our house, school is a welcome return because it gets everyone (including Holly and me) back on a routine. For us at Kingston, fall is the return of covered dish luncheons, Wednesday night suppers, youth bible studies, and children's programming. I say all that to say, fall is a great time to invite someone to church. I know we hear that all the time, and I know that's what you expect me to say; however, it really is a great time. Who are those people in your life you should invite? Do you know someone who does not have a church home? Do you know someone who has a church home but rarely, if ever, attends? Do you know someone who was hurt by their previous church and is looking for something different? Do you know someone new to the area? Inviting someone to church need not be awkward. I am not asking you to go try and save anybody. As Presbyterians, we believe that is God's job. I am not asking you to impose any beliefs on anyone.

As your pastor, the reason I encourage you to invite someone to Kingston this fall is because I really like what we have going on here and I want others to come be a part! After 2 years of ministry here, we have added over a dozen new members and only 2 have left. I am fully aware that a church cannot be all things to all people, no matter how hard we try. That's why there are so many different traditions. I love the environment here during worship. I love the hospitality during Wednesday night suppers (and the food), and I love the fellowship that takes place during covered dish luncheons on the first Sunday of the month.

One of my former professors from Columbia seminary, Dr. Ralph Watkins, recently conducted research on what people are looking for in a church, post pandemic. What his research found is that people are not looking for great preaching, outstanding music, a close parking spot, a bustling youth program, a cool website, or really good food. Now his research did find those things are important, but they are not what is *most* important now. What Dr. Watkin's research found is that what people are looking for in churches post pandemic is *warmth*.



Now, if you are like me, the first place your mind goes is: That's great Robert, that is why we have ushers and greeters at the door. Not so fast! Dr. Watkins research found that greeters do not count. In the kingdom of heaven, yes they count, because they are God's children, but in this research, they do not count. Why? People in the research said it is because it is their *job*. They expect ushers and greeters to say something, they say something to everyone who comes in the door, or at least they should. In order for a church to feel warm, someone, other than an usher or greeter, has to make an effort to talk to them and it feels authentic.

The conclusion was post pandemic, people are desperate for authentic relationships. That is what a warm congregation feels like. Now, do not hear this as me trying to say we are not warm. I think we are one of the warmest congregations I have ever been a part of; however, the research is clear, people are looking for a church home these days that feels warm. Other words I might use are inviting, authentic, relational, and welcoming. All of those fall under the umbrella of being warm. New people are going to come in our doors this fall. It is going to happen because people are looking for a church to call home. Whether you invite someone and they show up or you see a random person who very well maybe giving this whole God and Jesus thing one last shot, remember, they are looking for warmth. We are coming out of a two year stretch where people have been very isolated, alone, or even afraid. This is all complicated by a news cycle and political climate that says if you have a differing opinion not only are you not welcome, you might just be of Satan! People are looking for God to give them that warm, human connection that we all so desperately need, especially now. So let's be warm to a world that is so often cold and bitter. Thanks be to God!






Compassion Child Update:




The Remind app is a wonderful tool, and Holly uses it to send reminders of events, locations, and any changes to the schedule. If your child/student has a phone, they can join, too!
