Dear Kingston Family,

Thank you all for making this Lent and Holy Week special. We had great attendance all around. We had a successful Good Friday service, and as far as I could tell, it may have been the first Good Friday service in the history of Kingston! The sunrise service had exceptional weather and of course the sanctuary was full at 10:30 as we celebrated the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

So where does that leave us in the liturgical calendar? Well, the 40 days leading up to Easter are what we call "Lent" (it's actually 46 days but we don't count the 6 Sundays because every Sunday is a celebration of the resurrection). Easter changes every single year if you haven't noticed. The date of Easter will always fall on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox. The vernal equinox falls on or around March 21st, and it is when the sun is directly in line with the equator, meaning the entire earth for that day has exactly 12 hours of sunlight and 12 hours of darkness. In the northern hemisphere the vernal equinox marks the official start of the season we call "Spring." This means Easter can never be before March 22nd, and it can never fall after April 25th. It will always fall somewhere between those times. This means every year 46 days before Easter will be Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent.

It also means 50 days after Easter, or the 7th Sunday after Easter, will be the day we call "Pentecost." Pentecost is the event that takes place at the beginning of Acts in which the Holy Spirit descends on the disciples and they start the beginning of the Christian church as we know it. The time in between Easter and Pentecost is known as "Eastertide" or "Easter time." So why 50 days? Well the gospels and Acts tell us that the resurrected Jesus was on earth for 40 days before he ascended into heaven. Sometimes I forget that, it's easy to gloss over. I often assume that Jesus rose from the grave and off he went to heaven, but that's not what the Bible tells us.

If you remember from our scripture reading in 1 Corinthians 15 this past Sunday, Paul tells us the risen Jesus did not only appear to the disciples, he appeared to 500 some people! Scholars think Paul wrote 1 Corinthians around 54 AD, some 20 years after the resurrection, and Paul says some of those eyewitnesses are still alive! So for the next 6 Sundays we will be in Easter time, celebrating the resurrected Christ while he lived and spoke amongst the people, proving that in fact death did not have the last word. Friends, it is this Easter event that marks the hallmark of our faith. The resurrection is what unites Christians all over the world. Christians may disagree on many expressions of our faith but every Christian believes in the resurrection, because without it? Well I'll leave you with Paul's words "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile, and you are still in your sins." -1 Corinthians 15:17




