

## FEBRUARY 2024

Dear Kingston Family,

I'm writing to you today from Paducah, KY, where I am staying as I am heading back to the airport soon and will return to Conway tonight, February 1st. Paducah is located on the banks of the massive Ohio River and on the other side of the Ohio River is the state of Illinois. There is not much to southern Illinois. It is very rural, lots of rolling hills and farmland. About a 30 minute drive from Paducah, out of nowhere in the rolling farmland, is the Shawnee Correctional Center.

It is a state penitentiary for the state of Illinois. Prisons are intimidating places to visit. When you pull into the parking lot, there are signs designating where visitors can park and another sign indicating that visitors belongings, including vehicles can be searched at any time for any reason. After exiting the car you see miles of razor wire fencing, with a 3-4 story watchtower with armed guards overlooking the premises. When you approach the lobby, you have to be let in with the guard unlocking the door electronically. Every time a door is unlocked there is a loud buzzing sound letting you know to open the unlocked door.

When you approach the front desk you have to sign in, provide 2 forms of identification and. tell them the prisoner you are planning to visit. You are then let into a holding area where you must put all your belongings, including rings and watches into a locker and then a guard pats you down. You then walk through a metal detector, have a stamp placed on your hand and then you exit the building and walk outside to another building in the prison complex.

This second building is where visitation is allowed. You have to then walk through 3 more locked doors and then enter a cafeteria area where tables and chairs are set up. There is a guard that oversees the visitation area. There are strict rules while you visit.

There is a table assigned for us , and the prisoner must face the guard at all times, the visitor has their back to the guard. You must keep your hands on the table at all times and any touching must be limited to

*(continued)* ...a brief hug when arriving and departing. Visitors are allowed to visit once a day in 4 hour blocks. There are vending machines in the area, so yesterday Kip and I were able to enjoy lunch together. We each had a sandwich and some chips, Kip also enjoyed having a soda. I am the only one allowed to get up and get the food—prisoners cannot leave their seats without permission or the visit is terminated, and usually the only reason they are allowed to get up is to use the bathroom.

I had a lovely time visiting Kip. We played several different card games. We talked about what his plans are when he gets home. He was asking about our Wednesday night supper schedule in November. He is eager to get home and misses Kingston Presbyterian very much.

This time with Kip reminds me of Jesus' words in Matthew 25:34-40, some Bibles refer to this section as the parable of the Sheep and the Goats. Many of you are familiar with these verses:

*Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world, for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me.'"* (Emphasis mine)

These words are so impactful because Jesus tells us that when we help those who are in need: the hungry, the thirsty, those who need clothes, the sick and the prisoners, we literally are helping Jesus. I think this church does such a good job helping folks who are in need. Kip feels all the love from all of you. Every one of the cards, letters, phone calls, prayers, even those who simply ask how he is doing, that is a way of "visiting" Kip. He asked me during our visits, "Who all asks about me?" because he knows when you ask how he is doing you care. He feels that care.

As I was departing the prison on Tuesday, there was a guard who works on Kips block where his cell is located. He and Kip know each other on a first name basis, and they talk to each other a good deal. As I was heading through the locked doors to depart, the guard asked me, "So you are his pastor?" I said, "Yes, Kingston Presbyterian Church back in Conway, SC." The guard continued, "Man he has been talking my ear off for weeks about you coming to see him, like I mean he has been over the moon excited." I said, "Well I am glad that makes him happy." The guard finished by saying, "Thank you for coming to see him, I can tell what a positive difference it makes for him."

Thank you Kingston for being a Matthew 25 church.
