

Dear Kingston Family,

I was sitting in a meeting yesterday at the First Presbyterian Church of Myrtle Beach, SC. If you are not aware, part of our duties as ordained pastors in the PC(USA) is not only to serve the church we are installed at, though that is priority number one, but also to serve our denomination at large. Each Presbyterian church is governed by its session, a group of ruling elders elected by the congregation to oversees its functions and responsibilities.

Each local church belongs to a larger organization known as the presbytery. Presbyteries are located geographically, and each presbytery has an executive presbyter, who basically serves as the supervisor to all the ordained pastors in the presbytery. Kingston is part of New Harmony Presbytery. New Harmony spans the areas of Sumter, Hartsville, Bennettsville, Marion, Conway, the Grand Stand, all the way down to Georgetown.

The presbytery is not unlike a local church in that it also has committees that serve certain functions. I serve on a committee known as the "Committee on Ministry" or "COM" as we call it. The Committee on Ministry helps support pastors at our churches and their staff. We help churches that have conflicts between the pastor and congregation or even between 1 or more ruling elders. We help churches that have been hurt by their leadership to heal. We also oversee the approval of pastors who are being called to New Harmony Presbytery, as we actually have to sign off on their terms of call.

I was with another pastor and a ruling elder yesterday meeting with a gentleman who was a retired Baptist minister but felt called to serve a small Presbyterian church nearby. Being that he was not ordained in the PC(USA), he wanted to have permission to oversee the celebration of the sacraments and be able to moderate their session. This church had 10 people coming to worship when he arrived. That's right, I did not leave off a zero- 10 whole people, 5 of them were on session! Why did he want to transfer? In the one year he has been filling in the pulpit, they now have 50 coming to worship. They have grown 5 times!

As we were discussing the reasons for growth, we kept coming back to a conclusion that is actually backed up by research. Post pandemic, what the research is showing is that people are looking for connection in a local church more than anything else. Yes, good parking is important, a talented choir or musician is important, good preaching is you know, whatever, seeing young families is important, but what folks really crave these days is connection. This small little church knew the importance of connection and they grew.


I think we do this really well at Kingston, too. I was reminded of this at the new member dinner last Wednesday. Our ruling elder Frances Dennis, who led the program asked each new member to say, "Why did you choose Kingston?" (continued pg2)

Over and over again, people said, "The people here are so welcoming!" We do a really good job of welcoming people. I know I am biased when I say that, but when I am on vacation or away for continuing ed, I will often go visit another congregation to worship, usually out of town. I kid you not, there have been times I have walked in, worshipped and not a single person said a word to me. The numbers show that we welcome people well. We had a gross increase in membership last year of 13%. We had a net increase of 9.2%. For most mainline churches, 5% in this area was around the norm, we over doubled that. Now, I know, "numbers are not everything," that is true; however, they are something. When that 13% says out loud in front of everyone it is because they felt welcomed, they mean it. As we head toward Easter, now is a great time to ask someone to come check out Kingston and see what the Spirit is doing, but also keep living up to our reputation for being the warm welcoming congregation in our community. I will leave you with Paul's words to the church in Rome: "Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God." -Romans 15:7

From the book of Luke...




