Dear Kingston Family,

One of the things January reminds me of is how thankful I am for our officers. Our elders, deacons, and trustees. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." The congregation has called officers because the congregation has discerned their gifts for ministry. For others of you, what are the gifts God has given you that we could use at Kingston further to do the work of Christ in our own walls but also in our community? For those of you already serving, what are new ways you can stretch your gifts this coming year? Serving together in a variety of ways is how we build the church up to be the church in the world today.
