

No one in Jesus' day would exchange his life for that of a shepherd. Shepherds were the lowest among the people. Yet, to them in their rejection and unreservedness God shows up, not simply to proclaim peace but to give peace. To them came the God of Peace.

It is no wonder they went away, spreading the news: "When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about." (Lk. 2:15)

The world we live in searches for peace through human effort, learning and good decision making. But peace is not a hidden mystery, it is a living person: Jesus.

The heart at peace with God will know the peace of God. The shepherds, no doubt, left in peace that day. They walked to peace. Luke 2:16 says, "So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger."

Here are some things you need to know about peace:

- (1) Peace reigns wherever Jesus is. They could have gone their way, but they hurried to the manger (V.15). They walked to the Prince of Peace.
- (2) Peace is like wildfire—it spreads. In (V.17-18) Luke tells us they spread the news of Jesus and all who heard it were amazed.
- (3) Peace leads to praise. In (v.20) says, "they returned praising God for all that they had seen..."
