

April Showers Brunch



But so many Christians daily experience sadness, depression, darkness, and doubt. Most of this has their root cause of idolatry. But here's the thing: when we think of idols, we think of some wooden or molten god, sitting on a stand somewhere or in a temple. That kind of idolatry is far removed from a Biblically centered view of idolatry. So, what then is idolatry? Idolatry is disordered or misplaced love. Whatever we love more than God by allowing it to control our emotions, time, energy, or delight has become our idol.

How do idols affect our lives?

- (1) Idols distract us from fully seeking God, and joyfully living out his and our purpose (Jonah 2:8)
- (2) Idols paralyze our emotional and spiritual energies and breed fear and insecurity (Psalm 16:4)
