



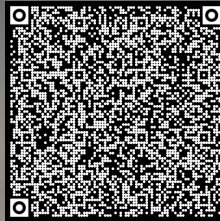

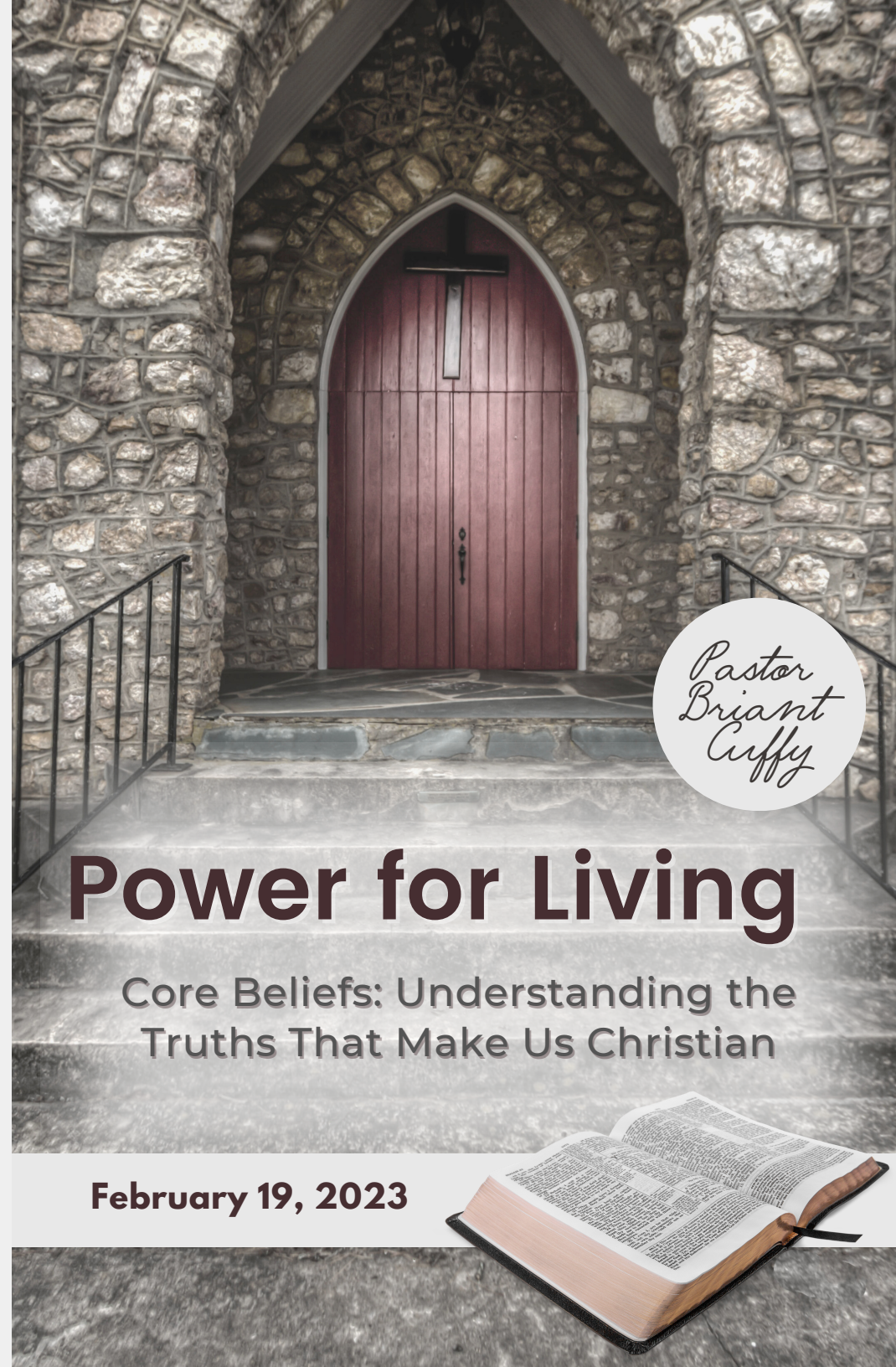


A church should feel like a family. At Crosswalk Church we

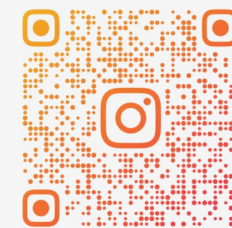
## Acts 2:1-13
